Gwinnett County Police

The department is responsible for:

- investigation of crimes
- responding to 911 calls
- maintenance of public order
- providing law enforcement services to 700,000+ county residences
- providing support law enforcement services to 125,000+ city residences.

The department has approximately 720 sworn positions and 288 civilian positions.

Gwinnett County Sheriff

The department is responsible for:

- oversight of the jail operations
- service warrants
- execute and return process and orders of the courts
- court security
- serve civil process
- manage sex offender registry
- inmate transport.

The department has approximately 559 sworn positions and 128 civilian positions.

Gwinnett County Courts

The Court system reviewed by the committee consists of seven areas:

- Solicitors Offices with 64 positions.
- Juvenile Court with 61 positions.
- Recorder's Court with 17 full time and 3 part-time positions
- Probate Court with 24 positions.
- Superior, State and Magistrate Court with 117 full and part-time positions
- Clerk of Court with 107 positions
