

SUBJECT: West Precinct 2009 Detail Summary

From May 14th -17th, 180 people (140 of which were with GCPD) conducted "Operation Conscious Community" in the area of South Norcross Tucker Road. The purpose of the detail was to address a number of community concerns. This area was selected because of past patterns of crime in and around the area including robbery, burglary, and entering autos. Moc One was our Command Post in a grocery store parking lot.

This was organized by involving multiple units working various hours of the day. The day generally started around 7 am and ran until about 4 am. This was the core of its success. Because everyone was there with a different purpose, multiple issues were being worked on and being resolved at the same time. Upon each unit's arrival, a briefing provided them with maps, a stolen vehicle hot list, and crime prevention flyers to pass out to the community.

Although a general action plan arranged, specific decisions were left up to the unit's line supervisors. For example, DUI and Motor supervisors decided the best locations for road checks since they had that background and prior experience with these. In another example, QOL arrived with a specific plan already in place for each day.

In the first day alone, nearly 75 persons were arrested. Roadchecks contributed to the largest number of arrests. Most roadchecks involved about 25 officers and ran about an hour.

During the detail's three day run, no crimes were reported in the area. Following the detail, there was a sharp decrease in all criminal activity including armed robberies, burglary (residential and commercial), and entering autos. Just as important, citizens and business owners praised our efforts. In what was normally a crime hot spot, the detail made citizens and business owners feel safe again.


